

My great granny, my grandads mum worked for Princess Mary at Harewood House in East Yorkshire when she had married the viscount Lascalles nears of Harewood.

She worked as pastry cook in the kitchens having moved from Frogmore House to Harewood House.

There is a picture of Harewood House where if you look carefully on the top floor. She has marked her room with a x.

She met my great grandad there. He was a butler. There is a photo of a menu she cooked for princess Mary when her mother Queen Mary came to visit. The menu is translated as the following

Caviar- fish roe - very special

Torte is a tomato quiche

Sole with oyster sauce

Veal tartar means just tossed on either side

Didonneau is turkey roast

Ice cream with choc sauce for pudding and anchovies with olives after....

Great granny is the one on the right in the cooks photo and great grandad is in his butler's outfit outside Harewood House we think about 1930's not exactly sure when.

Also my grandad was well known in the newspaper works, known as Fleet Street for launching more newspapers than anyone else notably The Mail on Sunday and Metro amongst many of the titles he was responsible for.
